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

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Online Peer Review Tool

The Online Peer Review Tool allows review applications to go through a review process to provide internal feedback on the application.

The final review can be used to benchmark against other institutions.

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
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


Peer-review dashboard

Review Manager




Roles within the OPRT

Feedback to date

- Divergent experience: Some trial participants are less familiar with the peer review process than others
- Economies of scale: To save time, question templates could be reusable across faculties and/or pre-generated question templates could be available
- Operational efficiencies: Review set up and preparation of documentation can be completed by administrative staff, streamlining academic staff input
- Video tutorials are very helpful and preferred to user manuals
- Professional development of peer review and the OPRT welcomed

Value Proposition

Initial research has identified further potential benefits including:

- Cost, time and resource efficiencies compared to existing peer review processes
- Identification and promotion of inter-institutional best practice
- Facilitation of reporting requirements to TEQSA
- Alignment with accreditation standards
- Data security: data storage and data transfer
- Scalable and transferable peer review model



Next Steps

- Consolidate Alpha trial findings within phase extension
- Develop Beta requirements and implement Beta trial in May 2016
- Develop business case modelling including alternative service models and cost/benefit analysis
- Develop sustainable business strategy for 'Go to Market' readiness
- Communication and engagement with broad network forums
- Establish external reference group
- Develop network alliances
